#### Notes

1. Field study can be repeated for a total of 6 credits. A professional elective can be substituted for Field Study.
2. Professional electives must be ITDS, ARCH, IDS, ART, or other approved by the Interior Design Program Chair.
3. Students must maintain an overall 2.0 minimum GPA (in all courses) for satisfactory progress toward the degree.
4. A minimum overall 2.0 GPA is required for graduation.  
Students must maintain a 2.5 minimum GPA in "ITDS" courses for satisfactory progress toward the degree.  
If a student's GPA drops below 2.5 in "ITDS" courses, courses with a grade below 2.5 must be repeated to elevate the GPA to 2.5 before continuing in the degree. A minimum 2.5 GPA in "ITDS" courses is required for graduation.  
Restricted Major Requirements: Students who make application to Interior Design through the internal transfer process must meet the following requirements prior to entering the major.
  - 1) Min 2.5 GPA in all courses prior to ARCH 1015.
  - 2) Application to Summer Qualifying Design Lab; Interview for Summer Qualifying Design Lab
  - 3) Faculty Review of Summer Work and 3.5 min in Lab for admission to 2nd Yr Lab
  - 4) Faculty Review of Summer Work and < 3.5 and >2.0 min in Lab for admission to 1st Yr Lab
  - 5) Letter of intent
5. This course incorporates the university VIEWS [Visual Expression, Writing and Speaking] requirements. Consult the Virginia Tech Curriculum for Liberal Education guide: <http://www.cle.prov.vt.edu/index.html> for the University Policy on VIEWS. A copy of the specific School proposal is available in the School's administrative offices. The VIEWS communication requirement is met through an array of Theory and History courses, Technology courses, Practicum courses, and Studio courses.
6. Foreign Language Requirement: students who did not complete 2 units of a foreign language in high school must earn 6 credits of a college foreign language, such credits to be in addition to those normally required for graduation. (the high school foreign language courses must be the same language to satisfy the language requirement.)
7. Refer to the Curriculum for Liberal Education Guide on the Virginia Tech website to select courses to satisfy this CLE requirement.
8. There are no hidden prerequisites if courses listed are taken in order.
